

# TRANSFORMATIONEN

KLANGSPUREN VON LASSE-MARC RIEK

At eight locations, the sound artist Lasse-Marc Riek transforms the Palmengarten and Botanical Garden into a subtle soundscape with sound installations, his “transformations.” Within these sound installations, the artist, who is internationally active with exhibitions, concerts, teaching assignments, and projects, draws from a wealth of material: the inaudible world under water, the notorious ultrasonic sounds of bats as well as electrical voltages of plants, and much more are transformed so they speak, resound, and sing.

## SOUND FOREST

Wind-driven bamboo stalks clattering against each other and rustling leaves transform the bamboo grove into a sound forest. Its animal inhabitants, including amphibians, insects, and birds, also make their voices heard with whirring, calling, and buzzing sounds, so that the installation creates an audacious sound play that rings through the grove.
